Inside this edition of Vision you can learn about how companies large and small are all doing their bit to create jobs. There's still a lot of negative talk about the economy – but here in North West Leicestershire we are very much 'open for business'.

Did you know unemployment in the district is only around 3%? Or that 38 of the county's top 200 firms are based here?

None of that happens by accident. It's thanks to a lot of hard work by our companies – from huge international companies like Pall-Ex to extraordinary people like Sharon Eason, who started 'Meals in Fields' literally from inside her kitchen larder. Find out more about her inside.

On August 15 our Business Focus team hosted a redundancy support and jobs fair – after Kuehne & Nagel announced it was closing its Bardon warehouse, with the loss of 300 jobs.

More than half – 168 people – came along to meet employers including Tesco, Pall-Ex, the GI Group (representing Marks and Spencer) and specialist recruitment agencies.

Job Centre Plus, HMRC, Stephenson College, our housing and benefits advice teams and other partners were also there to help.

And you can do your bit too. For example, every time you separate your recycling into the different boxes, you're helping keep your Council Tax bills down – because 'separating at source' means we can earn up to twice as much. That's worth $\pounds I$ million a year!

We've got some tough decisions to make over the next few months about our budget and services. But there's every reason to be optimistic about the future of our district.

Life changing!

Hundreds benefit from home improvements

Tenants have praised 'life changing' improvements to their homes.

Our Decent Homes Improvement Programme has already invested £4.5m in more than 500 homes – fitting new windows, doors, heating systems, kitchens and bathrooms – by contractors Kier and Lovells.

We plan to invest a further £17m by March 2015 to improve more than 3,000 homes – creating jobs and apprenticeships, and saving tenants money on their energy bills.

Councillor Roger Bayliss, portfolio holder for housing, said: "We're determined to make North West Leicestershire a place where people feel proud of their homes and communities.

"The Decent Homes Improvement Programme will continue to improve the quality of life for


thousands of council tenants."

By March 2014, the council will invest another £10.5m to improve 1,500 homes – with a similar sized programme the following year.

The Homes and Communities Agency is funding 90% of the programme (just under £21m) – with the council covering the rest.

And when the residents of Smith Court in Whitwick planned a get together for families and friends, they wanted their community looking at its best.

Step forward our contractors Lovell – who volunteered to repaint the benches. They also donated some plants for our tenants to get the place looking just great.

The idea came from our housing officer Polly Page, who was helping the residents organise their event.

Cllr Roger Bayliss, portfolio holder for housing, said: "This is a great example of how communities are made stronger when people and businesses offer some time and effort to small improvements."







Let's create a lorry litter free North West Leicestershire

One of the district's biggest companies has signed up to beat lorry litter louts – with more set to follow.

Pall-Ex is spearheading our campaign – the first of its kind in the East Midlands – to keep laybys and verges free of rubbish.

In July we joined up with Keep Britain Tidy and Ellistown-based Pall-Ex – founded by Ex-Dragons Den star Hilary Devey CBE – after almost a quarter of commercial drivers admitted throwing litter from their vehicles in 2013.

Hilary said: "We know that even the smallest of actions can have a big impact. We've worked hard to make sure all our drivers operate in a responsible way and respect the environment.

"By joining forces with North West Leicestershire District Council on this campaign, we hope other companies in the area will get the message too and help make the district an even better place to live and work."

Items found dumped at lay-bys across the district include bottles of urine, bags of human excrement, discarded magazines, drink cans, food packaging and tyres.

Councillor Alison Smith MBE, Deputy Leader and Portfolio Holder for Community Services said: "The types of waste we're finding at these sites poses a risk to public health.

"We will be asking haulage and distribution companies to follow the lead of Pall-Ex.

"By pledging support companies will be demonstrating they have responsible staff and are committed to protecting the environment."

How? Because it means your recycling is cleaner – so it's more in demand and has a higher value.


Paper collected separately is worth nearly twice as much than if it was mixed with cardboard.

Volunteers keeping it clean

You can help keep your community clean by fastening your box lids to stop items escaping on windy days.

We also have a growing army of volunteers doing their bit. Our Street Action Team supported more than 1,000 people at a series of litter picking events over the last year. Together they collected the equivalent of 800 bin bags of rubbish. Every little helps our small Street Cleansing Team of just 13 litter pickers — thank you!

For example, in June and July, three volunteers from Friends of Thringstone

removed an incredible 386 bags of litter from the village. If everyone did the right thing then they wouldn't have to do it at all.

Sharon's recipe for success

Meet the small family business helping other families all over the country....

If you're a fan of camping or caravanning, you'll know how hard it can be to cook quality, healthy meals – and find the ingredients when you're miles from home.

Sharon Eason had the same problem – so decided to do something about it.

Now, after just two years, Sharon's recipe website 'Meals in Fields' is helping people whip up delicious meals – and boosting trade among hundreds of local shops up and down the land.

The idea is simple: visit www. mealsinfields.co.uk, look up a recipe, then find out about the nearest farm shop, butchers and greengrocers near to wherever you are on holiday.

People can leave their own recommendations about their

favourite places – including restaurants and other things to do.

Sharon says: "It's perfect for parents wanting to feed healthy meals to their kids. Every recipe has been sent in by fellow caravanners – designed to be easy to make in a small space with minimum equipment."

Sharon started Meals in Fields after she retired in 2011 by turning her kitchen larder into a small office – now she has a unit in Coalville's Springboard Centre. Husband Dave came on board when he retired in 2012 – and they've just taken on their first employee.

Local small businesses pay a small amount for a page on the website – which has seen visitor numbers rise by 400% over the last two years.

Sharon said: "I saw a letter in the Camping and Caravanning Club Magazine from someone who had cut short a holiday because the family could not face another

dinner of sausages on the BBQ. The last sentence of the letter read 'is there a website that can help me?' That's where the idea came from.

"It took two years of hard work to build the website and get people to send in their recipes. Then people started saying 'the recipes are great – but where can I buy the ingredients?"

"So we started creating the directory of local businesses. Now not only can we help families – we're also helping small family businesses to grow too."





What does the future hold?

"By 2015 we aim to be employing a dozen people – and be helping small businesses everywhere. By bringing us together, we can collectively start to compete with the supermarkets.

"If you're based in North West Leicestershire, we'd love to have you sign up. A basic entry is free – or a more detailed one is just £5 a month. It's all about having local knowledge – nationally."

Our Business Focus team helped Sharon find the unit at the Springboard Centre – where she uses fellow tenants BEC Business Services to handle her finances. She said: "That's a real weight off my mind and it allows us to concentrate on growing the business. Everyone here has been so helpful and supportive."

£8m fund to create jobs

Leicestershire's manufacturers can bid for a share of almost £8m to boost the local economy - and we're here to help you do it.

Leicester and Leicestershire Economic Partnership (LLEP) has unveiled round three of its Regional Growth Fund - a £7.8m scheme to create more than 1,200 jobs.

Grants from £25,000 to £150,000 are on offer for local small and medium sized businesses looking to grow - providing they can raise three-quarters of the money themselves. This could include buying new machinery, property and infrastructure improvements or building expansions.

Our Business Focus team has already arranged an information session for district businesses to learn about Regional Growth Fund grants.

To qualify, firms must be based in the county with a plan for growth in the next year that creates jobs. Eleven district firms have already applied.

Better Business for All bears fruit

We all rely on regulations to keep us safe – such as properly licensed taxi drivers and pubs and clean restaurants and takeaways.

But companies can find the rules hard to understand – tying up time better spent generating sales and creating jobs.

So we're taking the lead with Leicester and Leicestershire Local Enterprise Partnership's (LLEP) to become more business focused.

We call it the 'Better Business for All' programme – and it's two years old this month.

We're improving our support for start-up firms and those looking to relocate, and developing a single system for offering business support.

We're improving how we train our Environmental Health team, and recruiting a network of business champions so we better understand the needs of local companies.

Later this year we're trialling a system where all regulators can use information collected by just one – so companies won't have to provide it many times over.

Cllr Tony Gillard, portfolio holder for business, said: "We want to reduce both real and perceived regulatory barriers to growth. Very often companies can feel overwhelmed by the number of different regulators they have to deal with.

"We might not be able to change the law – but we should look at how we provide those vital regulation services."

Thirteen regulators are now taking part – including the Food Standards Agency and Leicestershire Police.

People to Places bus hits the road!

A brand new 15 seater minibus has hit the road in Coalville to help people get to work.

It's the latest part of the 'People to Places' transport service – designed for people who work shift patterns starting early in the morning or late in the evening, when public transport is not readily available.

Run by the Marlene Reid Centre's community transport team, it's for organisations with employees without transport who need to get to work. You might not live near a bus route – or not be able to use public transport.

District leads the way for business **GROWTH**

Almost 20% of the county's 200 biggest companies are based in North West Leicestershire.

Together, the 38 district-based companies had a turnover of more than £6 billion in the last year – more than Leicester and second only to Blaby, home to retail giant Next.

The Leicestershire 200 Annual Review is a joint venture between the Leicester Mercury and De Montfort University. Total turnover of all 200 firms was £24 billion.

One example is Ashby firm Plastribution -

the UK's leading distributor of plastic raw materials. It registered a 59% increase in turnover over 15 months to move from 74th in 2012 to 46th this year.

The company employs 60 local people and hopes to increase turnover by another 40 per cent over the next three years. It supplies the car, packaging, electronics and medical sectors.

Managing director Mike Boswell told the Mercury: "Markets have worked for us and, despite the recession, demand for our expertise and product range has driven our recent substantial revenue growth. But we are not resting on our laurels."

Have your say on HS2

The Government has invited the public to comment on its proposed route for the HS2 railway.

Since your councillors objected to the original route in February, the proposed tunnel under East Midlands Airport has been extended so it won't clash with the planned Roxhill freight depot.

But Council Leader Richard Blunt said: "HS2 will make it harder for us to strengthen tourism in the National Forest. And it will have a negative impact on our countryside and thousands of residential properties.

"We believe the Secretary of State should look again at following a route along the A38 to Derby – a city centre station there would offer far greater regeneration benefits than Toton."
