1	WELCOME AND INTRODUCTION	
	• Chris Brown, Stronger and Safer Communities Team Manager, welcomed everyone to the meeting and gave apologies for not hosting the Parish Liaison at the Council Chamber, due to the accommodation of a new committee meeting. CB gave thanks to 1620s House and Gardens for holding the Parish Liaison at such short notice.	
	• A brief update on LRALC was given. LRALCs AGM is taking place on 15th June 2019 at County Hall and booked delegates should receive the papers week commencing 3rd June.	
2	HS2 UPDATE – Nyasha Nyambuya, LCC, HS2 Community Liaison Advisor and Jenny Allen, LCC, HS2 Project Manager.	
	• Routes and Impacts LCC explained their role is to ensure that affected residents & businesses are heard, and can access the support they need. The construction will bring disruption and a direct impact on the highway network. LCC will be working on diversion routes and road closures. The construction will also have indirect impacts such as the large transient workforce will bring extra demand on services such as public health and police. LCC and HS2 are working together with NWLDC and parishes to mitigate issues.	
	• <b>Programme and Next Step</b> The HS2 programme is very long and is currently in the initial phase in which cases can be argued at committees and mitigations can be put in place. LCC's position in the programme is that they support infrastructure but if there are issues they will ensure the correct mitigations take place.	
	<b>ACTION</b> : Amy to circulate email <u>hs2@leics.gov.uk</u> . <b>ACTION</b> : LCC reported they would be contacting parishes direct on their work and support.	
	Questions and Answers:	
	• Measham Parish Council asked if the proposed routes are definite as there are alternatives. LCC responded that these are the proposed routes and official routes will not be published until next summer.	
	• Heather Parish Council raised concerns on where workers will live. LCC explained they are investigating this as they want to know what services will be required and how this will affect the community. HS2 may use local people in the construction phrase.	
3	<b>OPERATION LONDON BRIDGE</b> – Chris Brown, NWLDC, Stronger and Safer Communities Team Manager and Cathy Tibbles, Whitwick Parish Council, Parish Manager.	
	<ul> <li>Operation London Bridge was raised by Whitwick Parish Council. The district council has been pulling together a detailed plan on what should happen upon the death of a Royal or senior figure. Their guidance for what the district council does has been taken from National Association of Civic Officers (NACO) protocol on how to mark such a death, together with that of LCC based on Operation London Bridge.</li> </ul>	
	• Within NWLDC's plan, there is a section of location of Books of Condolences. Each mourning box will contain a book of condolence, supply of paper, black cloth and framed portrait of the person deceased. The district council is currently putting these sundries together.	
	Ashby de la Zouch Town Council suggested loose-leaf pages for the Condolence Book so if     any undesirable comments are made they can be removed.	

	Ashby de la Zouch Town Council also expressed that communications are very quick so response to an event of death needs to be quick as there will be an expectation from the public that the parish council takes lead.	
	<b>ACTION</b> : Parishes asked at the meeting for Operation London Bridge to come to a future meeting and for more information on NWLDC plans.	
	<b>ACTION</b> : Parishes also wanted to know what they are to do in the event operation London Bridge is enabled.	
4	TREE MANAGEMENT – Nick Fell, LCC, Forestry Manager and Paul Ashmore, NWLDC, Open           Space and Parks Team Leader	
	• Nick Fell (NF) highlighted the laws in place including the Occupiers Liability Act and Health and Safety at Work Act, and briefed on the role of The National Tree Safety Group (NTSG), explaining that it is composed of a number of organisations with an interest in tree risk management.	
	• The inspection standards produced consist of three tiers and when it comes to tree risk assessment, the tree inspection takes place at certain times dependant on the risk the tree poses. A large tree with noted defects is considered high risk with an inspection every 18 months. With medium risk trees (large to medium size with no noted defects and located in areas of periodic use) inspections are every 3 years. Low risk trees don't pose a risk and have no noted defects.	
	LCC use a different package to NWLDC for the maintenance and inspection history of trees. The package NWLDC uses are for different trees dependent on their stage of life and size. In order for NWLDC to supply a quote, they must first see the tree.	
	• LCC offers ongoing advice on tree management to schools and site staff. They have not yet rolled this out to parish councils.
