Thank you for consulting Leicester City Council on the partial review of your Local Plan. Leicester City Council supports the commitment to meet the unmet need arising from the city through joint working with the HMA partners. However, given that the Government introduced standard methodology last year we would suggest deleting reference to HEDNA as shown in yellow below

#### Policy S1 – Future housing and economic development needs

Policy 51 - Future housing and economic development needs

Over the plan period to 2031 provision will be made to meet the housing and employment land needs of the district as identified in the Leicester and Leicestershire Housing and Economic Development Needs Assessment (January 2017). This means that:

• provision will be made for the development of a minimum of 9,620 dwellings (481 dwellings per annum) which is the Objectively Assessed Need (OAN) and Housing Requirement for the district;

• provision will be made for 66 hectares of land for employment purposes (81, 82 and 88 of less than 9,000sq metres)

• Provision will also be made for 7,300sq metres for shopping purposes.

The Council will continue to work collaboratively with the Leicester's Leicestershire Housing Market Area (HMA) authorities to establish the scale and distribution of any additional provision that may be necessary in North West Leicestershire

## **Local Plan Partial Review**

When our adopted Local Plan was approved by the Planning Inspectorate, we were required to carry out a substantive review within two years, i.e. by February 2020.

We are now proposing to extend the timescale by which we have to submit this substantive review – through a process called a Partial Review. We believe this will allow us extra time to gather robust evidence to support our planning policies contained in the Local Plan, including:

- Housing need
- Employment land need
- Climate change
   Health and wellbeing

The Partial Review therefore seeks solely to amend Policy S1 (and supporting text) of the adopted Local Plan.

We are not proposing to make any other amendments to the adopted Local Plan through this Partial Review - more fundamental changes will be made through the Substantive Review which is being undertaken in parallel

### **Publication Consultation**

en today (20 November 2019) and 8 January 2020 the District Council is consulting on a publication version of the Local Plan Partial Review

The Publication version is the final stage of plan making before the Local Plan Partial Review is submitted to the Planning Inspectorate

We have published the documentation for consultation – this consists of

- Publication consultation document (containing an amended Policy S1 of the adopted Local Plan)
- . Sustainability Appraisal (incorporating Equality Impact Assessment and Health Impact Assessment)
- Habitats Regulations Assessment

Statement of Representations Procedure/Statement of Fact – outlining the details of the consultation

Statement of Consultation – showing the various stages of consultation undertaken up to this point

Statement of Common Ground — which has been agreed informally with each of the local authorities in the Leicester and Leicestershire Housing Market Area to support the Partial Review. Each authority will now take this through their own
