Our Parish Council was concerned, initially, and still is about the sections on transport and accessibility in the various sections of this document. Whilst we are not disputing the facts presented as to their legality or soundness, we have always been concerned about the apparent mismatch between issues around cycling, walking and public transport as opposed to own car transport. In most villages, the age profile is usually fairly high: there is no public transport (in this village it was stopped in 2005/6): there are not many streetlights that are on when it is dusk. This means that anyone wishing to "do anything" or "go anywhere" have to use their own car. There is no way that, however good the cycle tracks are, that people of a certain age are going to take to their bikes instead of their car and it seems totally unrealistic to expect that. The situation for villages is very different with public transport to town, large settlements and cities.
