Guidance Notes:

1. This form is to be used for an application for a grant of an unlicensed family entertainment centre gaming machine permit under the relevant statutory provisions set out in Section 247 and Schedule 10 of the Gambling Act 2005.

2. An unlicensed family entertainment centre is entitled to provide an unlimited number of Category D gaming machines available for use on the premises. Category C gaming machines CANNOT be made available for use and thus there will be no 'designated adult areas' required at the premises.

3. An application for a permit may not be made if a premises licence has effect in respect of the premises.

4. A permit may not be issued in respect of a vehicle or vessel (or part of a vehicle or vessel).

5. The applicant must be aged 18 years or over.

6. An application for a permit may only be made by a person who occupies or proposes to occupy the premises and proposes to use the premises as an unlicensed family entertainment centre.

7. The permit will last for duration of 10 years. A renewal application must be made 2-6 months before the expiry date of the permit.

8. These permits can not be transferred. Change of name is only permitted where the permit holder changes his/her name or wishes to be known by another name.
