

Village Memorials

St Peter's Church Bardon

The Grade II churchyard cross at St Peter's Church was unveiled on 4 September 1920. It is made of Portland stone, supported on Bardon granite. The three slate plates commemorate 31 local men who fell in the First World War.

The memorial was designed by George Nott and paid for by public subscription. Four further names were added to commemorate those local men who fell in the Second World War.



St John the Baptist, Hugglescote

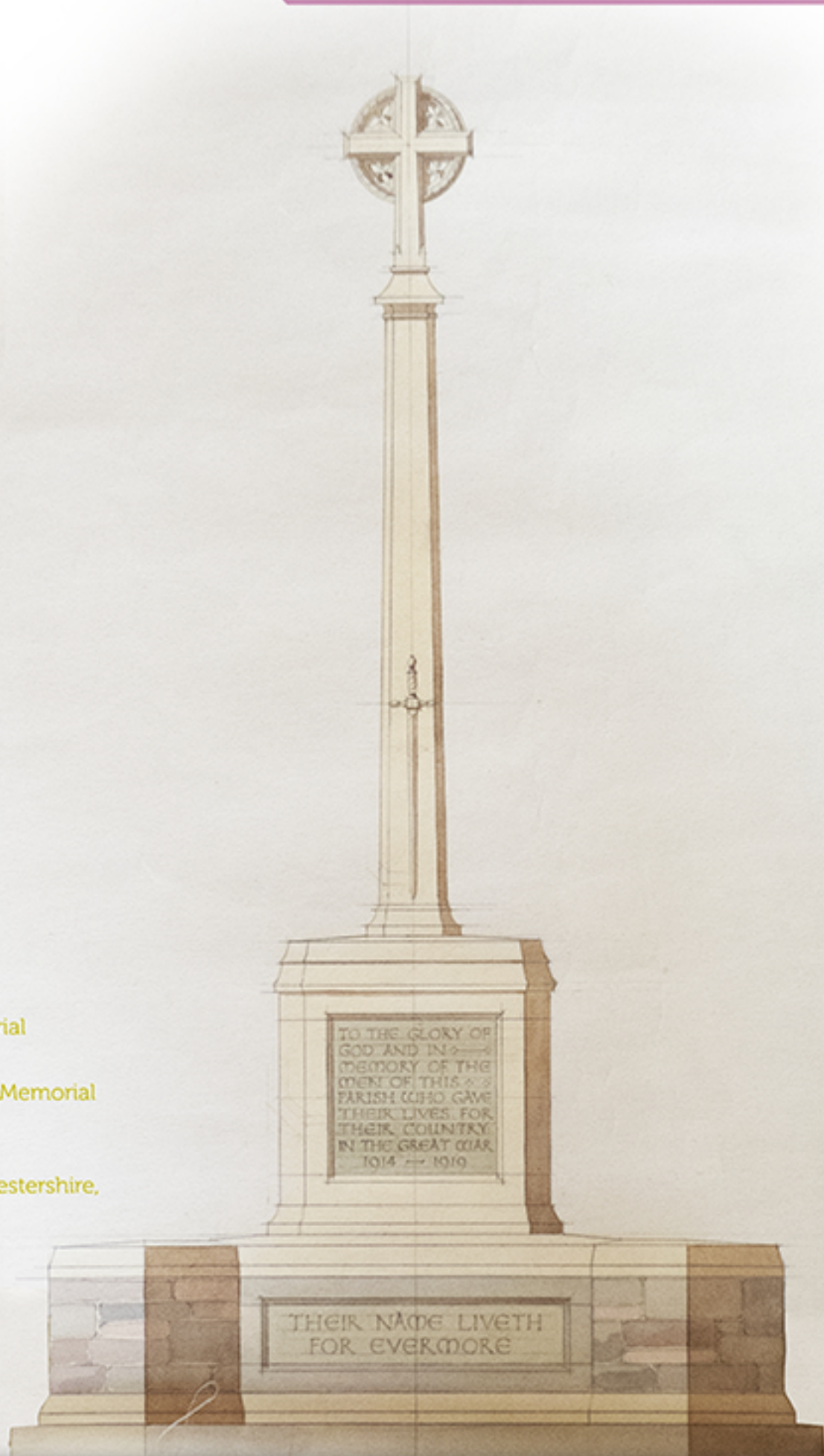
Inside the Church a war memorial with a decorative stone frame and inscribed tablet was erected to commemorate the men of the parish that died in the First World War.



St Christopher's Church, Ellistown

Mounted on the eastern wall in the narthex (lobby area) is the memorial that was unveiled on the 10 December 1919 to commemorate the casualties of the First World War.

Made by Joseph Herbert Morcom, names are inscribed in gold lettering on a Swithland slate tablet that is surrounded by an ornate Chellaston alabaster frame.
